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Dear readers and colleagues,

You are reading the third edition of our publication on higher education landscape in Slovakia. The aim of these series is to inform the public and our academic colleagues abroad about the structure and developments in the Slovak higher education area in the last years.

According to Slovak legislation higher education institutions are top educational, scientific and artistic institutions in the Slovak Republic. Their mission is to develop and cultivate knowledge, wisdom, goodness and creativity and thus contribute to the development of education, science, culture and health for the welfare of the whole society.

The academic tradition in Slovakia is dating back to the Middle Ages. This year we are celebrating 550th anniversary of the Universitatis Istropolitana (at present known as Academia Istopolitana) – the first university established in the country. However modern higher education history dates back to 1919 when the Comenius University in Bratislava was established.

At present Slovak universities and schools of higher education are doing their best to integrate into the European Higher Education Area (EHEA). Since 1999, when the Bologna declaration was signed, higher education institutions has started reforms in order to ensure they provide first-quality education, perform excellent research and development, offer services for the sake of society and create appropriate environment for students and staff.

Slovakia has a wide range of higher education institutions (public, state and private) that offer comprehensive, technical and other specialized higher education to its citizens as well as foreigners.

According to ongoing comprehensive (institutional) accreditation – a process that evaluates institutions ´ activities including teaching, a level of research, development, artistic and creative activities, 16 higher education institutions out of 22 so far evaluated ones were assessed as universities. Another Accreditation Commission ´s project showed that 37 excellent research teams work at our higher education institutions according to international standards. Excellent research teams can be found across the whole spectrum of science and technology, e.g. in Humanities, Arts, Engineering and Technology, Natural Sciences, Medical and Health Sciences and Agricultural Sciences.

In that spirit, I wish you happy reading and a pleasant journey through Slovak higher education landscape!

The Higher Education System in the SR

The general prerequisite for admission to higher education study is a secondary school-completion certificate ("vysvedčenie o maturitnej skúške") issued after passing the secondary school-completion examination taken upon completing 13 (or exceptionally, 12) years of study.

Higher education institutions administer the admission examination.

Study at higher education institutions

Higher education institutions provide study programmes at three levels:

- **1. The Bachelor's Study Programme:** Takes as little as three years at least and up to four years (architecture, fine arts and design).
- 2. The Master's, Engineer's and Doctor's Study Programmes: These study programmes take from one year up to four years, so the standard length of study for the bachelor's study programme and the continuing programme of the second level in the same or related field of study totals five years at least. It may also be carried out as a continuous study connecting the first and second levels of higher education. In this case, the standard length of study is four years at least and six years at most.
- **3. The PhD Study Programme:** The standard length for full-time students is three years at least and four years at most, or for part-time students five years.

1st level

- "bakalár" (Bc.)

- "magister" (Mgr.), in the field of art "magister umenia" (Mgr. art.)
- "inžinier" (Ing.) in technical, agricultural and economic fields of engineer's programmes and in the field of architecture and town-planning the academic degree of "inžinier architect" (Ing. arch.)
- "doktor všeobecného lekárstva" (MUDr.) in the field of general human medicine
- "doktor zubného lekárstva" (MDDr.) in the field of dental medicine
- "doktor veterinárskeho lekárstva" (MVDr.) in the field of veterinary medicine

3rd level

- "doktor"- "philosophiae doctor" (PhD.)
- "doktor umenia"- "artis doctor" (ArtD.)
- "licenciát (Catholic) teológie" (ThLic.)
- "doktor (Catholic) teológie" (ThDr.)

Examina rigorosa

The holders of the academic degree of magister may take the examina rigorosa, which includes the defence of a rigorosa thesis. After its successful completion, the higher education institutions award the following academic degrees:

- doktor prírodných vied (RNDr.) in natural science study programmes
- doktor farmácie (PharmDr.) in pharmacy study programmes
- doktor filozofie (PhDr.) in social science and art science study programmes
- doktor práv (JUDr.) in law study programmes
- doktor pedagogiky (PaedDr.) in teacher training and sports study programmes
- doktor teológie (ThDr.) in theological study programmes except for the study programmes in the field of Catholic Theology.

Credit system (since academic year 2002/2003)

The standard load of a student in the entire academic year is expressed by 60 credits, for a semester 30 credits and for a trimester 20 credits.

The grading is on a scale of A-FX:

- A (excellent) = 1 (able achievements)

− **B** (very good) = 1.5 (above-average achievements)

- **C** (good) = 2 (average achievements)

- **D** (laudable) = 2.5 (acceptable achievements)

- E (satisfactory) = 3 (achievements fulfil only the minimum criteria)

- FX (unsatisfactory) = 4 (achievements do not fulfil even the minimum criteria)

The higher education institution or college, if the study programme is carried out at the college, may in selected subjects decide not to assess students by marks but to set instead other criteria for their successful completion as a condition for accumulation of credits.

For assessment of overall study achievements of a student in a determined period, a weighted study mean is used. It is calculated in such a way that in the assessment period the products of number of the credits and numerical assessment are summed up for all subjects ascribed to students and the result is divided by total number of credits achieved by the student during the given period. For subjects that the student enlisted for and did not complete, mark 4 is added up to the weighted mean. The subjects that are not evaluated by a mark are not included in calculation of the weighted study mean.

The academic year starts on September 1 of the current year and ends on August 31 of the following year. It is composed of two semesters (winter and summer) or three trimesters. The organisation of the academic year is set by the college or the higher education institution, if the higher education institution is not divided into colleges.

About the Slovak Rectors' Conference

SRC creates conditions for cooperation of universities and schools of higher education in Slovakia and mutual flow of information among them. Furthermore, SRC establishes and maintains contacts with foreign partners as rectors' associations in other countries. SRC is a full collective member of the European University Association.

The Slovak Rectors´ Conference is represented by its president Prof. Rudolf Kropil. The Presidium is an executive body that consists of a president and two vice-presidents, Prof. Karol Mičieta and Prof. Marek Šmid.

Over the past years, SRC has concentrated on some topics that are of highest importance. The quality assurance, autonomy, science and research, funding and public procurement belong to the most accurate ones. Regarding other activities, we have organized or co-organized several conferences and workshops having nation-wide impact, meetings with elite national or European leaders in the last years.

Another interesting activity of SRC is the establishment of the Award for Excellence in Arts in 2012. The prize is awarded each year to students or graduates with the aim to increase visibility of artistic activities performed or created at Slovak higher education institutions for exceptional artistic work or artistic activity with a supranational character. So far, SRC has awarded it to four excellent students:

- SRC Award for Excellence in Arts 2015 Mgr. art. Adriana Debnárová a brilliant innovative architect,
- SRC Award for Excellence in Arts 2014 Mgr. art. Andrea Kopecká a young creative artist,
- SRC Award for Excellence in Arts 2013 Mgr. art. Teodor Kuhn, PhD. a talented director,
- SRC Award for Excellence in Arts 2012 Bc. Pavol Bršlík a well-known opera singer.

Short description: The Academy of Fine Arts and Design (VŠVU) is a public university. Its students and faculties' work has been recognized not only in Slovakia, but also abroad. VŠVU is a fully accredited university providing complete bachelor's and master's study programmes in the fields of Fine Arts, Design, Architecture and Restoration. In addition, the doctoral study programmes include the history and theory of Fine Arts and Architecture. Short description: The Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava (VŠMU) is a public university. It is the highest accredited educational, artistic, and scientific and research institution in the fields of theatre, puppetry, music, dance, film and media and related theoretical and managerial studies in Slovakia. The university educates and trains creative people for performing arts (theatre, opera, ballet and modern and folk dance, puppetry and children theatre), film and media and music (instruments, singing, conducting). It educates high quality teachers, arts managers, theoreticians and critics of arts, as well. Scientific research, international relations and projects: The Academy runs on the daily basis own theatre studio (performing at 4 stages – Theatre Lab, Studio Burkovna, Studio Kaplnka and Studio 1), opera studio and concert hall Dvorana, cinema club 35 mm, which offer plenty of public artistic events. Each faculty organises related international festivals, such as an international



theatre festival of higher education schools "Istropolitana Project", an international festival of film schools "Áčko" and a contemporary music festival "Orfeus". The teachers and doctoral students are leading personalities in various research projects in the field of theatre, film and music and dance arts. They

are involved in variety of research and practical research projects on international and domestic level, including the publishing activities (in the cooperation with

leading professional cultural organizations as Theatre Institute, Slovak Film Institute or Music Centre).

VŠMU has bilateral agreements on mutual cooperation with around 60 institutions within the EU which enable the students and teaching staff exchange within the framework of the Erasmus+ and Erasmus



Mundus programmes. The Academy is a member of a number of international associations including ELIA, ESTA, AEC, AITU, ENCATC, CILECT, FIRT, AICT, TECOM ITI and UNIMA.

Comenius University in Bratislava

Short description: Comenius University in Bratislava is the oldest and biggest university in the Slovak Republic. Established in 1919, the university draws on the tradition of Academia Istropolitana that was founded in 1465 in Bratislava by Matthias Corvinus, the King of Hungary. Since its founding the university has ranked among the best educational institutions on the national level and it has become an internationally recognised centre of scientific study and research. Being the most comprehensive provider of classical university education in Slovakia, Comenius University has retained the status of the Slovak National University. Comenius University in Bratislava has 13 faculties and serves 27,000 students each year within all three degree study programmes, 21,000 of whom are full-time students. Comenius University offers more than 700 diverse study programmes encompassing a broad range of human knowledge - from medicine, humanities and social sciences, to natural sciences, mathematics and theology. Almost 2,400 international students from 70 countries enjoy studying at the oldest university in Slovakia.

Scientific research, international relations, projects: Comenius University is an outstanding scientific institution that continues to rank among the top 3 – 15 per cent of universities in the world based on several independent rankings (URAP, RUR, CWUR, THE WUR etc.). In 2014, Comenius University was involved in 716

scientific projects with multi-source funding totalling € 22.6 million. Innovations and progressive research trends will be supported by the research centres at the Comenius University Science Park and BioMed Martin, a biomedical centre. *The Comenius University Science Park* has the aim of serving as a comprehensive research incubator for the university and for private sector entities working in the area of science

and technology. It will operate in the fields of molecular medicine, environmental medicine and biotechnology. The total expenditure for the project totals almost \leqslant 42



million and is being brought to fruition with the help of the EU funds. *BioMed Martin* is an elite research centre at the Jessenius Faculty of Medicine in Martin which cooperates with centres of excellence, competence centres and other specialized centres of the faculty with the aim of producing excellent outputs in research and development in the field of molecular medicine, oncology, respirology and

neuroscience. Total expenditure on the BioMed Martin project totals more than € 26.3 million and is financed to a significant degree by the EU funds.
