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Hungarian higher education in numbers 1.



- > 63 higher education institutions, of which
 - state-run: 6, ecclesiastical: 25, private: 11, public
 interest asset management foundations: 21
- > 186 faculties
- > 78 training locations
- 1.428 training programmes
- 2.450 study programmes
- > 72 dual trainings

Hungarian higher education in numbers 2.



- > **328.562 students** (status on 15.10.2024), of which
 - full-time: 221.440 (67,40%), part-time: 107.122 (32,60%)
 - 180.842 female (55,04%), 147.720 male (44,96%)
 - 45.755 (13,93%) foreign students
- > 31.170 lecturers, researchers and teachers, of which
 - 13.647 female (43,78%), 17.523 male (56,22%)
 - holding academic qualifications: 16.367 people (6.370 female, 9.997 male)

What trends characterise the renewed Hungarian higher education? – I. Autonomy



- **1. Organizational independence** (in private higher education institutions President, Chancellor, appointed by the Maintainer)
- 2. Determining the age limit for the employment of lecturers (in private and ecclesiastical higher education institutions also over the age of 70)
- **3.** Pay structure at own discretion (no uniform pay scale)
- 4. Autonomy in the higher education admission procedure -100 institutional points out of 500 points at own discretion and determination of the compulsory secondary school leaving examination subjects for the study programme (200 points)

What trends characterise the renewed Hungarian higher education? – II. Relationship with sectoral management



- 1. Setting objectives
 - relationship between principal and agent
- 2. Performance indicators and accountability
- 3. Predictability
 - multi-annual financing contracts

What trends characterise the renewed Hungarian higher education? – III. Model-changing institutions

- 1. Public interest asset management foundations
 - maintainer and owner of the University (Act IX of 2021 on public interest asset management foundations performing public duty)
- The executive body of the foundation is a 5-member board of trustees
 - members are professional
- 3. Defining the University's strategy
- 4. Preserving academic freedom
- 5. Discussions with European institutions

What trends characterise the renewed Hungarian higher education? – IV. Ecclesiastical institutions



- 1. The higher education institution is maintained by the Church
- 2. Value-based training
- 3. Integrating religious aspects into education
 - openness to the world
- 4. Quasi public interest asset management foundation financing contracts
